Autumn Class



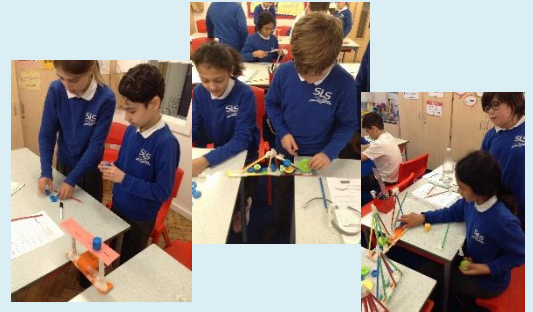
