Dear Parents and Carers,

I cannot believe it's our last full week of the year. It has been an extremely difficult year for our little St Luke's community with the ongoing pandemic, but we have come out the other side as strong as ever.

Today the children's annual school reports came home along with an emailed letter explaining some of the judgements. As usual we have included the children's attendance and punctuality in line with Camden's guidelines, but we understand for some families Covid has had a heavy impact on these figures.

On Monday we will be hosting a Zoom open evening and links will be sent out on the day. This is an open forum to drop in and meet your child's new teacher and to say thank you to their current teacher. No appointments are necessary. This week myself and Mrs Wickham have hosted meetings to welcome our new Reception parents and the children have had the opportunity to meet their new teacher as part of the transition process.

Summer Class



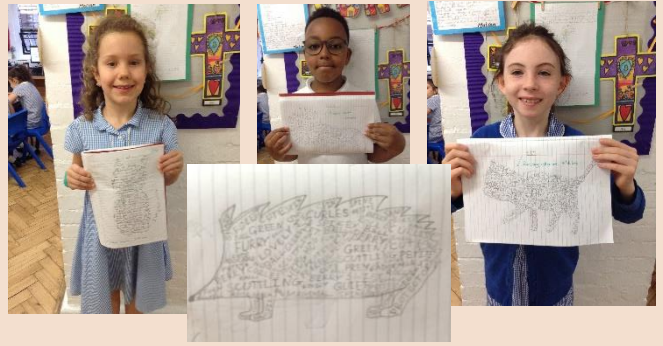
