### **Spring Class**



This week in Spring Class, we have been looking back over the Reception year and thinking about memories and achievements. The children had time to reflect on skills that they have improved, things they are proud of and activities they have enjoyed. When we did group reading this week, it was wonderful to see the progress they have made, and also the confidence that they now have in their abilities. In Maths this week, we have been looking at finding 1 more and 1 less, sharing equally and counting beyond 30. On Monday and Tuesday, the children worked really hard on preparing for, and performing their assembly. Many thanks to parents for their encouragement and for helping the children to learn their lines.









### **Summer Class**



This week in Summer Class, we explored the features of a book review and then wrote our own reviews based on 'Charlie Cook's Favourite Book', sharing our opinions and favourite parts. In Maths, we are learning to read the time on an analogue clock, focusing on telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes. In R.E, we explored The Parable of the Good Samaritan. We discussed times when we had helped someone or when someone had helped us, and reflected on how those experiences made us feel. As part of last term's R.E unit, we visited the London Central Mosque. We had a wonderful time at Regent's Park, enjoying a picnic together in the sunshine before touring the mosque. It was a fantastic trip and a lovely way to build on our learning.





### **Autumn Class**



This week in Autumn Class, the children have been busy writing their very own books! They've shown great dedication in editing, publishing, and beautifully illustrating their stories, we're so proud of their creativity and hard work. In Maths, we've been exploring money, learning how to add and subtract amounts, and solve real-life problems involving change. In P.E. Autumn Class held their very own Wimbledon! The children played exciting doubles matches, showing off their growing tennis skills, teamwork, and sportsmanship.



#### **Winter Class**



In Winter Class this week, we have been focusing on creating some strong narratives during English lessons. We have used 'Boy in the Tower', a book we are familiar with, to create stories with description and detail. In Maths, we have been concentrating on statistics using our knowledge of angles to create pie charts and line graphs, as well as representing statistics from our own surveys. In R.E, we have explored how rules can be interpreted using a version of the creation story as well looking at how values can be perceived in Islam. Following our visit to the Crick, we used materials they gave to us, to create oobleck and we'll be using this to further explore properties of materials.



# Give your child the best start in life – every school day counts.



At St Luke's we believe that all children deserve an education of the highest quality in order to flourish and enjoy a life filled with meaning and purpose. To support us with this, we ask parents to ensure their children are in school and on time every day. The school gates are open at 8:50am and children should be in their classrooms to be registered at 9:00am. The latest statutory guidance for schools, **Keeping Children Safe in Education 2024**, has a specific paragraph addressing children who are absent from school.

### Children who are absent from education

175. Children being absent from education for prolonged periods and/or on repeat occasions can act as a vital warning sign to a range of safeguarding issues including neglect, child ... exploitation - particularly county lines. It is important the school or college's response to persistently absent pupils and children missing education supports identifying such abuse, and in the case of absent pupils, helps prevent the risk of them becoming a child missing education in the future. This includes when problems are first emerging but also where children are already known to local authority children's social care and need a social worker (such as a child who is a child in need or who has a child protection plan, or is a looked after child), where being absent from education may increase known safeguarding risks within the family or in the community.

Our whole school attendance target is 96% which allows for 8 days of illness over the year.
