Spring Class

This week in Spring Class, we have been reading and acting out 'Where the Wild Things Are' by Maurice Sendak. Our classroom has transformed into a forest, just like Max's room! We even made a boat to sail across the ocean like Max and spotted some Wild Things hiding in our classroom. The children helped to create vines by cutting and sticking paper chains to decorate our forest. In Phonics, we have been learning how to read and write the sounds s, a, t and p. The children have also been getting to know each other's names, as well as learning to read and write their own. In Maths, we have been practising counting using different objects.

It has been a fun and imaginative week full of creativity and learning!

Summer Class

In Summer Class this week, we have been using the book 'Rabbityness' by Jo Empson to describe characters and their feelings when things change as well as describing settings. In our Maths, we have been ordering and comparing numbers as well as finding 1 or 10 more or less than a given number. In RE, we have been considering how we show stewardship of God's creation by creating posters of how we look after the different parts of our school . This has linked with our PSHE, where we have been working on how to create a safe classroom environment by working on how to demonstrate good listening skills.





Autumn Class



This week in Autumn Class, the children have continued writing recipes focussing on writing titles and introductions which engage the reader, and have been self-assessing and editing their work. In Maths, we have been using a range of resources to practise times tables, and continued working on addition and subtraction within the context of place value, including crossing 10s, 100s, and 1000s. In History, our focus was on the beginnings of the Ancient Egyptian civilisation, and in PE the children worked in pairs to choreograph a dance related to our History topic. Moses and his 'calling' by God was the subject of our RE lesson and we started to connect this to the idea of vocation.



Winter Class



This week in Winter Class, we have been practising our column addition and subtraction methods. Later in the week, we used these skills to help us solve multi-step mathematical reasoning questions in a variety of contexts. In English, we have been making predictions and inferences about our new class book 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas'. In History, our focus was on Winston Churchill, and the children carried out detailed research to better understand his life and his role in World War II. In PE, the children enjoyed developing their passing and ball control skills during hockey matches.



Give your child the best start in life – every school day counts.



At St Luke's we believe that all children deserve an education of the highest quality in order to flourish and enjoy a life filled with meaning and purpose. To support us with this, we ask parents to ensure their children are in school and on time every day. The school gates are open at 8:50am and children should be in their classrooms to be registered at 9:00am. The latest statutory guidance for schools, **Keeping Children Safe in Education 2024**, has a specific paragraph addressing children who are absent from school.

Children who are absent from education

175. Children being absent from education for prolonged periods and/or on repeat occasions can act as a vital warning sign to a range of safeguarding issues including neglect, child ... exploitation - particularly county lines. It is important the school or college's response to persistently absent pupils and children missing education supports identifying such abuse, and in the case of absent pupils, helps prevent the risk of them becoming a child missing education in the future. This includes when problems are first emerging but also where children are already known to local authority children's social care and need a social worker (such as a child who is a child in need or who has a child protection plan, or is a looked after child), where being absent from education may increase known safeguarding risks within the family or in the community.

Our whole school attendance target is 96% which allows for 8 days of illness over the year.


