Spring Class



This week the children went on a local walk to observe different aspects of nature, linking to the Creation Story. The children thought about what they could see, hear and feel during the walk, and considered what these experiences taught us about how we should look after and care for the natural world. We also discussed different family structures and how each family is special in its own way. The children enjoyed comparing their baby photographs from then and now, noticing how much they have grown and changed. As part of our Kindness Challenge, we collected leaves during our walk, which we will be using to make gifts after half term. In Phonics, the children have started to write CVC words. It has been lovely to see them listening carefully to the sounds they can hear to help them spell.

In Summer Class this week, we have continued our work on diary entries by planning and writing about a day in the life of an animal character. In Maths, we have been practising our number bonds to 10 and 20 using Numicon and number lines, as well as recording the number sentences and extending this to number bonds within 100. In Science this week, we completed a sound survey of the school working out if the noise to our ears was reduced if we wore hoods or earmuffs. We also classified fruits and vegetables using the senses of taste and smell. In PE, we have been combining jumps, rolls and balances to create a sequence of gymnastic



Autumn Class



This week in Autumn Class, we have been working on developing a range of methods to support subtraction. In English we have been looking at developing our own characters for stories and learning about verbs and different types of adverbs. We completed our RE unit by revisiting the story of Ruth and making links between the old testament stories that we have learnt about this half term. In PE we completed our dance unit by choreographing a dance inspired by the wildlife of the Nile, and we started to put together our designs for jewellery inspired by ancient Egypt.









Winter Class



This week in Winter Class, we have been working systematically in Maths to solve a range of problems while consolidating our understanding of whole numbers and decimals. In Art, we have been sketching World War II planes, exploring different techniques such as shading and smudging with charcoal to enhance the detail and depth of our drawings. In Computing, we have been developing our coding skills by designing and creating our very own video games, combining creativity with logical thinking!



Give your child the best start in life – every school day counts.



At St Luke's we believe that all children deserve an education of the highest quality in order to flourish and enjoy a life filled with meaning and purpose. To support us with this, we ask parents to ensure their children are in school and on time every day. The school gates are open at 8:50am and children should be in their classrooms to be registered at 9:00am. The latest statutory guidance for schools, **Keeping Children Safe in Education 2024**, has a specific paragraph addressing children who are absent from school.

Children who are absent from education

175. Children being absent from education for prolonged periods and/or on repeat occasions can act as a vital warning sign to a range of safeguarding issues including neglect, child ... exploitation - particularly county lines. It is important the school or college's response to persistently absent pupils and children missing education supports identifying such abuse, and in the case of absent pupils, helps prevent the risk of them becoming a child missing education in the future. This includes when problems are first emerging but also where children are already known to local authority children's social care and need a social worker (such as a child who is a child in need or who has a child protection plan, or is a looked after child), where being absent from education may increase known safeguarding risks within the family or in the community.

Our whole school attendance target is 96% which allows for 8 days of illness over the year.


