Spring Class



This week in Spring Class, it was lovely to see the children back after their holiday. We continued with our Kindness Challenge and created leaf prints on candles. It was wonderful to hear the children's thoughtful responses about why we are doing this and how it shows kindness. We read 'What's in the Truck?' and explored birthdays as a celebration. The children even hosted a birthday party for Teddy in our classroom, which was lots of fun! We also explored Bonfire Night, discussing how people celebrate it. The children used different objects to create colourful fireworks on paper. In Maths, we went on a 2D shape hunt around our classroom, spotting and naming shapes in the environment around us.







Summer Class



This week in Summer Class, as part of our Kindness Challenge we created cards for the Evergreens with symbols and messages to send our thoughts and best wishes. In English, we have been working on poetry, looking at Edward Lear's nonsense poem, 'The Pobble Who Has No Toes.' In Maths we have continued to practise our number bonds as well as using 100 squares to add tens and ones. We have also spent some time this week thinking about the things that make us different as well as things we share, making sure that we always value each other.





Autumn Class



This week in Autumn Class the children have learned to recite the poem, 'Amulet' by Ted Hughes. They worked hard to memorize it, and took turns performing it for the class. Also, in English we have been practising the reading skills of predicting and summarising, as well as learning more about the process of illustration and book design in relation to 'The Wolf's Secret'. In Maths, we have been working on our understanding of multiplication and learning multiplication and division facts. The children all took part in our class kindness challenge of litter picking in the local area and worked on clay jewellery inspired by Ancient Egypt. In RE we have been learning about what the prophets foretold about the first Christmas.





Winter Class



This week in English, we have been exploring poems from *The Book of Hope*. The children enjoyed discussing a range of poems and used poetry terminology to express their ideas with confidence.

In history, we explored how the British diet changed during the war and considered the lasting impact these changes had on people's lives. In PSHE, we were delighted to welcome a visitor from the NSPCC charity, who spoke to the children about keeping themselves safe. The pupils engaged in thoughtful discussions and shared insightful ideas throughout the session.

Give your child the best start in life – every school day counts.



At St Luke's we believe that all children deserve an education of the highest quality in order to flourish and enjoy a life filled with meaning and purpose. To support us with this, we ask parents to ensure their children are in school and on time every day. The school gates are open at 8:50am and children should be in their classrooms to be registered at 9:00am. The latest statutory guidance for schools, **Keeping Children Safe in Education 2024**, has a specific paragraph addressing children who are absent from school.

Children who are absent from education

175. Children being absent from education for prolonged periods and/or on repeat occasions can act as a vital warning sign to a range of safeguarding issues including neglect, child ... exploitation - particularly county lines. It is important the school or college's response to persistently absent pupils and children missing education supports identifying such abuse, and in the case of absent pupils, helps prevent the risk of them becoming a child missing education in the future. This includes when problems are first emerging but also where children are already known to local authority children's social care and need a social worker (such as a child who is a child in need or who has a child protection plan, or is a looked after child), where being absent from education may increase known safeguarding risks within the family or in the community.

Our whole school attendance target is 96% which allows for 8 days of illness over the year.
